

Security Policy



West African Ventures Limited (WAV) embraces its obligation to protect employees and property from illegal and dishonest acts through an established security program. While the responsibility for the security of the company rests with WAV management, it is also the responsibility of each employee to do their part in contributing to the effective protection of themselves, facilities, vessels and property.

WAV Scribes to the Voluntary Principles of Security and Human Rights as were developed by Governments, NGOs and major oil and mining companies.

WAV is committed to take all reasonable and possible measures to minimise security threats at the workplace, to establish and maintain standards of security within its operations, which adhere to relevant aspects of the applicable laws and meet the highest standards applicable to the Industry.

WAV is also committed to:

- Provide personnel with a secure and safe environment in which to work;
- Involve personnel in security through awareness;
- Maintain clear and open communication with the workforce on security issues;
- Protect personnel, property, assets and equipment;
- Define contingency procedures to mitigate security emergency situations identified;
- Allow swift adjustment of the security system to make it appropriate to the actual security situation should an exceptional and unforeseen external event occur.

WAV Vessels and Port facilities comply with the International Maritime Organisation security regulation (ISPS Code). In order to comply with the ISPS requirements, WAV has developed a security organisation for each vessel and worksite. WAV's fleet is fully complying with the ISPS Code. Any subcontracted or chartered vessels are required to comply with the ISPS Code.
